Public Meeting Under the Planning Act

Tuesday, January 15, 2019

1. Call to Order and Roll Call

A Public Meeting under the Planning Act was held at 6:46 p.m. to consider a proposed amendment to the Zoning By-Law for the Township of McNab/Braeside in accordance with the provisions of Section 34 of the Planning Act, 1990.

2. Declare Meeting Open

Deputy Mayor Armsden stated that this is a Public Meeting held by Council under Section 34 of The Planning Act, 1990 and is declared open and further advised this Public Meeting is to consider an amendment to the Township of McNab/Braeside Zoning By-Law 2010-49 as requested by Applicant Tyler Root (Owner – Wendy Fuller) for Part Lot 5, Concession 2, 247H Dugald Road.

3. Disclosure of Pecuniary Interest and the General Nature Thereof

Members were asked to state any pecuniary interest and the general nature thereof before the item is discussed. No disclosures of pecuniary interest were declared at this time.

Deputy Mayor Armsden Chaired the meeting this evening.

6. Clerks Notice of Circulation in accordance with the Requirements of the Planning Act

The public meeting is a requirement of the Planning Act. In accordance with the Planning Act, notice must be given at least 20 days before the public meeting is held. Deputy Mayor Armsden requested that the Clerk confirm the date the notice was circulated and calculate that we had the required 20 days notice.

The Deputy Clerk advised the Notice was circulated to all property owners within 120m of the subject property on December 6, 2018. The Notice was mailed to the agencies as required under the Planning Act. The Notice was published on the Township website on December 6, 2018 and on the Township website, calendar and bulletin Board as well as at the property site.

Deputy Mayor Armsden stated that the 20 day notice having been given, declared the meeting properly constituted to transact its business.

Any person wishing to receive written notice of the Adoption of the Amendment being considered at this meeting must leave their name and mailing address with the Township Clerk by writing their name and address on the list posted at the back of the Council Chambers.

As required by Section 34 (14.5) of the Planning Act, Council is required to inform the public of who is entitled to appeal to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal, under Sections 34(11) and (19):

Under Section 34(11) - If Council decides to refuse an application or refuses or neglects to make a decision on an application within 120 days of the municipal clerk receiving the application, the applicant or the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, may appeal to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal by filing an appeal with the clerk of the municipality.

Section 34 (19) – Not later than 20 days after the giving of notice of passing of the by-law, the applicant, any person or public body who made oral submissions at the public meeting or made a written submission to Council, before the by-law was passed or the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, may appeal to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal by filing an appeal with the clerk of the municipality.

7. Clerks Reading of the Notice

Deputy Mayor Armsden requested the Clerk give a description and location of the Proposed Amendment.

The Deputy Clerk advised that the notice informed the public of the meeting date to be held on Tuesday January 15th, 2019 at 6:45 pm for the proposed amendment for land located on Part Lot 5, Concession 2, and 247H Dugald Road.

The Deputy Clerk read that the purpose of this amendment is to rezone a 0.73 hectare seasonal residential property to permit the installation of a new septic system to service the existing cottage.

The effect of the amendment is to rezone the subject lands from Environmental Protection (EP) to Limited Service Residential-Exception Five (LSR-E5) to permit reduced setbacks of 15 metres and 5 metres, for the proposed septic system and associated mantle, respectively, from the high water mark of White Lake and from the White Lake Fen Provincially Significant Wetland. All other provisions of the Zoning By-law shall apply.

The notice was dated December 6th, 2018 and signed by CAO/Clerk, Lindsey A. Lee.

Additional information regarding the Zoning By-Law amendment was available for inspection at the Township of McNab/Braeside Municipal Office during regular office hours.

8. Correspondence/Comments Received

Deputy Mayor Armsden inquired if there were any written comments received.

The CAO/Clerk advised that the written submissions received from the following:

Conseil des ecoles publiques de l'Est de l'Ontario (CEPEO) advising they do not have any comments or concerns.

Enbridge advising they do not object to the proposed application, however, reserves the right to amend or remove development conditions.

County of Renfrew Public Works and Engineering advising they do not have any comments or concerns.

Township of McNab/Braeside Director of Public Works advising he does not have any comments or concerns.

Township of McNab/Braeside Septic Inspector advising that the zoning amendment application for 247H Dugald Road for the construction of a septic system was submitted with a favorable Environmental Impact Study (EIS). It is recommended that a development agreement be entered into between the owner and the township and registered on title to implement the recommendations and Key maps of the (EIS).

A planning report from the Township planner was submitted with the Public Meeting Package for Council's information

The CAO/Clerk advised there was no other correspondence received either to object or to support the proposed application.

Deputy Mayor Armsden inquired if Mr. Bruce Howarth wished to speak to the proposed amendment.

Mr. Howarth reviewed the proposal as submitted by Mr. Root on behalf of Ms. Fuller requesting to reduce both the minimum required 30 metre setback to the high water mark from White Lake and the minimum required 120 metre separation from the White Lake Fen Provincially Significant Wetland (PSW). The reductions are required to permit the installation of a Waterloo BioFilter septic system on the subject lands. The site can only accommodate a 15 metre setback of the system and a 5 metre setback of the associated mantle. The application is supported by a scoped Environmental Impact Study (EIS), prepared by Muncaster Environmental Planning and Jp2g Consultants Inc., dated September 20, 2018.

Mr. Howarth further advised that should council decide to approve this amendment it is his recommendation that a development agreement be entered into between the owner and the Township of McNab/Braeside and registered on title to include the mitigation measures and best management practices to address potential impacts on water quality of White Lake, the White Lake Fen PSW and species at risk as outlined in supporting study as well as the planning report.

In response to a question from Council, Mr. Root explained the engineering of the BioFilter septic system and the placement of such on the property.

There were no other questions or comments from the applicants or Council.

11. Adjournment

Deputy Mayor Armsden advised that the Public meeting process is now completed. Council will give careful consideration to the arguments for/and or against the zoning amendment requested for this property.

Staff was also directed to proceed with the process for the development agreement as recommended in the planning report.

A By-Law will be brought forward to the January 22, 2019 Regular Council Meeting for consideration. The Public meeting was declared closed.

Deputy Mayor Armsden thanked everyone for their attendance.
