Financial Viability

- At 60 beds, The Grove is NOT financially viable
- \$1 million is required every 5 years from the hospital to subsidize the nursing home
- At 96 beds the nursing home will not require financial support from hospital operations.
- At 96 beds there is sufficient funding to support a portion of the capital cost of redevelopment. (At 64 there is insufficient dollars from operations to support a portion of the capital repayment)


What are the needs of Seniors in our community?

Seniors Village

- Address the growing needs of our seniors population – aging at home in their community.
- Community-based care instead of increasing LTC bed capacity alone
 - Supportive Housing
 - Assisted Living Services
 - Adult Day Program
 - Other community-based services



The issue: We need an additional 36 LTC bed licences!

- No new licences will be issued by the MoHLTC
- 306 licences in abeyance but and their is no process in place how they will be allocated
- An unknown number of facilities will not redevelop and may put there licences up for sale.

Our plans for a 96 bed facility are ready for MoH submission but the MoHLTC will not accept them until all the licences are secured


