12.1 Ottawa River Flood 2017

RESOLUTION - 287-2017

Moved by Deputy Mayor Armsden, seconded by Councillor MacKenzie

WHEREAS the 2017 flood of the Ottawa River damaged thousands of homes and cottages along the Ottawa River, response to the flood cost homeowners millions of dollars and untold disruption to their lives, and cost the government relief funds millions of dollars; AND WHEREAS valuable municipal emergency resources were tied up for weeks responding to safety concerns of their residents and properties; AND WHEREAS many schools, businesses and Government operations were forced to be closed during the flood; AND WHEREAS a rapid rise of the Ottawa River on the morning of Saturday May 6th of 1 cm every 5 minutes for 100 minutes, followed by 1 cm every 12 minutes for the next hour, yielding a total rise 25 cm in 160 minutes as measured at the Brittania Bay gauge cannot be explained by rainfall and spring runoff alone; AND WHEREAS the reservoir above the Des Joachims Dam is about 70 km long and up to several km wide; AND WHEREAS there was a rapid release of 2.5 feet (30 inches, or roughly 76 cm) of water from this reservoir via the Des Joachims Dam and spillways beginning on April 27th; AND WHEREAS this released water pulse moved downstream over the next week or so along the roughly 220 km distance along the Ottawa River to Ottawa, bringing the water levels up about 1/3 of the 30 inches that was spilled (10 inches or roughly 25 cm); AND WHEREAS bottlenecks in the Ottawa River created higher rises of water level locally; AND WHEREAS the level of water above the Des Joachims Dam prior to the reservoir release on April 27th was around 2 metres below the stated capacity of the reservoir according to the Ottawa River Regulation Planning Board; AND WHEREAS residents above the Des Joachims Dam have reported that they had not seen water levels that low in decades; AND WHEREAS

the only gauge information available on the Ottawa River Regulation Planning Board website is located at Brittania Bay; THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT all municipalities bordering the Ottawa River and media be informed by the Ottawa River Regulatory Board 48 hours ahead of any major reservoir releases; BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Ottawa River Regulation Planning Board is requested to reinstate the missing data from the critical dates of May 4th to May 7th to its website for the Brittania water gauge; BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Ottawa River Regulation Planning Board make public through it's website all gauge data for 2017 for all working gauges along the Ottawa River and for any gauges showing water levels at dams on major tributaries into the Ottawa River including dams on the Madawaska, Bonnechere, Mississippi, Gatineau and any other feed Rivers, in cooperation with Hydro-Québec, Ministère du Développement durable, de l'Environnement et de la Lutte contre les changements climatiques, Ontario Power Generation, and Public Works and Government Services Canada; BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be sent to all municipalities in Renfrew County, to all municipalities that have borders on the Ottawa River, to all MPPs and MLAs, and to all MPs whose constituencies comprise the Ottawa River.
