AND WHEREAS the Township of McNab/Braeside's Council and staff are committed to working to make McNab/Braeside an inclusive community in which all persons can independently exercise their civil, political, social, and cultural rights on an equal basis and ensuring that everyone has the right to live in conditions of dignity, respect, and peace;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council of the Township of McNab/Braeside proclaim the week of the last Sunday in May, as National
