

TOWNSHIP OF McNAB/BRAESIDE
NOTICE OF PASSING OF A ZONING BY-LAW

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of McNab/Braeside passed By-law **2026-29** on the 19th day of May 2026, under Section 34 of the Planning Act.

AND TAKE NOTICE that any person or agency who meets the appeal requirements of the Planning Act may appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal in respect of the By-law by filing a notice of appeal with the Township of McNab/Braeside either via the Ontario Land Tribunal e-file service (first-time users will need to register for a My Ontario Account) at <https://olt.gov.on.ca/e-file-service/> by selecting Township of McNab/Braeside as the Approval Authority, or by filing with the Clerk of the Corporation of the Township of McNab/Braeside no later than **4:00 p.m. on June 9, 2026**. The filing of an appeal after 4:00 p.m., in person or electronically, will be deemed to have been received the next business day. The appeal fee of \$1,100 can be paid online through e-file or by certified cheque/money order to the Minister of Finance, Province of Ontario. If you wish to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT) or request a fee reduction for an appeal, forms are available from the OLT website at www.olt.gov.on.ca. If the e-file portal is down, you can submit your appeal to mcannon@mcnabbraeside.com. The Township of McNab/Braeside agrees to receive appeals via the OLT e-file service.

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a zoning by-law to the Ontario Land Tribunal. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf. No person or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of the appeals unless, before the by-law was passed, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the council or, in the opinion of the Ontario Land Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

Please note that third parties (anyone who is not a specified person or public body) do not have the right to appeal a decision for a zoning by-law amendment to the Ontario Land Tribunal.

An explanation of the purpose and effect of the By-law, describing the lands to which the By-law applies, and a Key Map showing the location of the lands to which the By-law applies are attached. The complete By-law is available for inspection in my office during regular office hours.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Council of the Corporation of the Township of McNab/Braeside passed Comprehensive Zoning By-law No. 2025-54 on June 17, 2025.

Proposed Zoning By-law Amendment

The purpose of this application is to rezone a 38.44 hectare farm property to permit reduced minimum lot sizes for a proposed surplus farm dwelling lot and retained parcel.

The effect of the amendment is to:

- 1) Rezone the proposed surplus dwelling lot from Agriculture (A) to Agriculture – Exception Nine (A-E9) to permit a minimum lot size of 0.73 hectares.
- 2) Rezone the remaining farmland from Agriculture – Exception One (A-E1) to Agriculture – Exception Ten (A-E10) to permit a minimum lot size of 37.71 hectares, while continuing to prohibit residential uses.

All other provisions of the Zoning By-law will apply.

Council considered all written and oral submissions received on this application, the effect of which helped Council to make an informed decision.

Other Applications

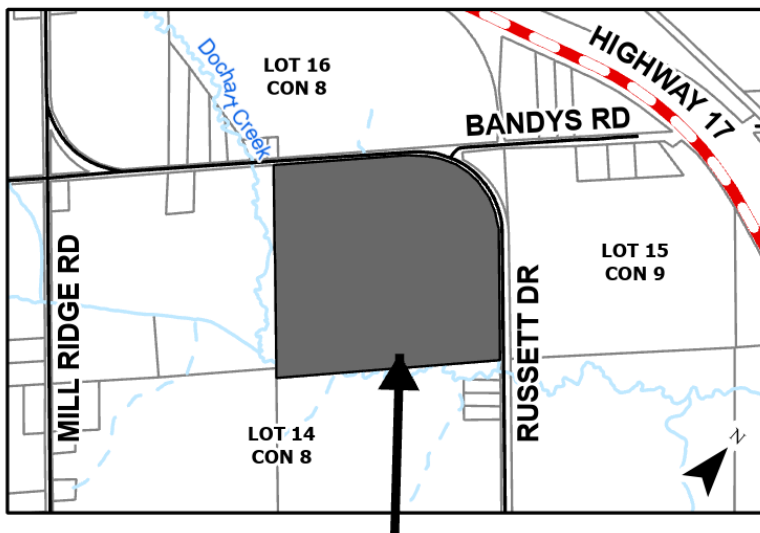
This zoning is related to consent (severance) application B105/25.

The lands affected by the amendment are described as Part of Lot 15, Concession 8, Russett Drive, in the geographic Township of McNab, in the Township of McNab/Braeside, as shown on the attached Key Map.

Accordingly, in providing such information, you shall be deemed to have consented to its use and disclosure as part of the planning process.
